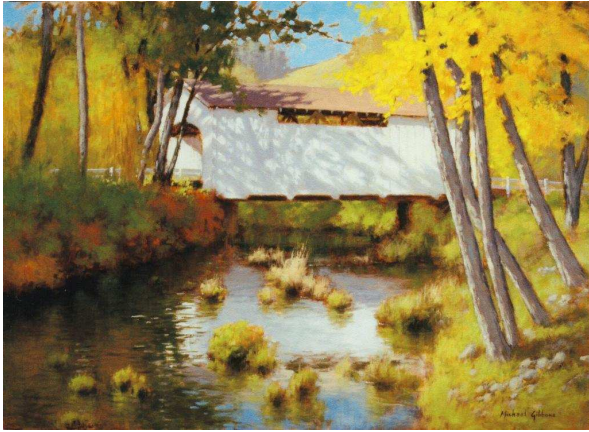

Focus on History

A stunning painting done on location near Wren, OR off Hwy 20. On a crisp Fall day Michael stood on Harris property near the Mary's River for 3 days painting to capture this historic bridge on canvas. Designed in the typical Howe Truss style, this 1929 structure exemplifies all that is romantic about covered bridges. The Harris Bridge is located along a winding gravel road near Wren. It is named after the Harris family who settled outside of Corvallis in 1890.
